The 10-day province-wide celebration of sights, sounds, snow and spirit is dubbed "The World's Largest Kitchen Party"; Festival du Voyageur celebrates the joie de vivre of the fur traders, who established the Red River Colony and the

ever-growing French-Canadian community in Western Canada.

The April dinner meeting was held in Assiniboine Park Conservancy where guest speaker, President/CEO Margaret Redmond, shared the new development strategy for the Park. The \$180-million makeover of Assiniboine Park will begin with four new amenities intended to make the city's biggest green space more accessible to families with little kids and recreational users.

The park will be completely renovated with natural-looking play structures, triple the size of the duck pond and skating rink, a water-play area in the woods, a family centre with washrooms, casual restaurant and a Winnie the Pooh commemoration. **Toucan Ridge**, a vibrant exploration of animal, bird and plant life of the new world tropics of Central and South America has recently opened.

The Centrepiece will be a new world class **polar bear exhibit**, dedicated to orphaned polar cubs, allowing underwater viewing of the aquatic carnivores and serve as an interpretive centre for Arctic and sub-Arctic environmental issues.

The Final submission of the Task Force on Repositioning Skål for the future, was submitted to the Executive Committee in January 2011, and has been reviewed by the EC. Many changes are being considered and will be discussed in detail at the ISC mid term meetings in St. Gallen, Switzerland, April 28-29. The changes will then be outlined/summarized in detail, submitted to all Clubs for their review and then each of the changes will be voted on separately at the Annual Congress in Turku in September, 2011. As the changes will represent two years public discussion with our membership and have important considerations going forward, it is extremely important that ALL Canadian Clubs plan to send a voting delegate to Turku to vote on any changes and the effect on relevant Statutes or By Laws.

Further to the sad passing last year of our previous Secretary General, Jim Power, we have now placed a job description for the position on the International Skål Web site. www.skål.travel The Executive Committee will be pleased to receive CV's from any skalleague who might want to consider this position. We are also discussing engaging an international association search firm to find suitable candidates for the position.
